Perhaps when you first started in Team Crane. Have a chat about the things that made you feel better about the situation. What would you say to an alien who landed in your garden to make them feel welcome and safe? What would you need to know about your alien to make it feel at home? What does it like to eat? What would it play with?

Expressive Arts and Design-In this clip, JC uses glasses filled with water to create a musical xylophone. He carefully taps each one to create the tune to 'Twinkle, Twinkle, Little Star'. Can you have a go at doing the same? Why do you think the amount of water changes the note or sound? Try changing what you use as your beater. Does that make a difference to the sound or note? What other tunes can you play?


