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Don't forget about Storytime on Tapestry. There will also be additional activities on there.



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Discuss the feeling words and colours that represent them, using questions such as: Do you remember what the yellow monster was feeling? Try and remember a time when you experienced feeling 'happiness.' You could use prompts such as: When do you feel happy? Model with an example, e.g. I feel happiness when you give me a hug or when the sun is shining. Repeat with the other feelings. Do you remember our colour jar at school? What colours did we use?
