Literacy Core Learning

Activities for the week ahead:

Mathematics Core Learning

We are learning about different angles and types of lines this week.

Key Vocabulary:

angle, quarter turn, half turn, full turn, rotate, acute, right angle, obtuse, straight line, degrees, perpendicular, parallel, vertical, horizontal, diagonal.

Activities for the week ahead:

Lesson 1- Right angles in shapes

This lesson looks at the number of right angles in different shapes. Remember that a right angle is 90°. Can you find right angles around your home?

Lesson 2- Comparing angles

Here we are looking at acute angles (less than 90°), Right angles (90°) and obtuse angles (More than 90° but less than 180°.) A straight line angle is 180°. Can you find different angles in your home?

Lesson 3- Horizontal and Vertical lines

This lesson looks at different lines within shapes, flags and everyday objects, can you find the different types of lines?

Lesson 4- Perpendicular and Parallel lines

Can you identify and draw different types of lines?

- Create a collage, painting or sculpture of your favourite predator or prey.

 environment, etc.
