

## Homework Activities for Show and Tell. Spring 1 Term

Here are a selection of fun activities that will support your child with their learning this term. Each week two children will receive a letter informing them it is their turn for Show and Tell. When your child is chosen, they can choose any activity from this list, complete it at home and bring it into school to share. Any additional activities your child completes can be brought into school to show me at any time.

To support the gospel value of FORGIVENESS this half term, write a prayer that shows how you have forgiven someone or someone has forgiven you.	Search the internet to find out about plants and trees. Then make an information page using the facts that you have found out.
A windowsill garden! Use the top off a carrot or celery and place on a saucer in a windowsill. Keep it watered and see what happens.	Make a poster about how to look after your local area. Think about what you want people to do.
Visit your local library to borrow story and information books about plants and trees. Write a book review about your favourite book.	Can you create a healthy meal? Think about which types of food it would need. Draw a picture or try making it with an adult.
Learn to count in steps of 2, 3, 5 and 10 forwards and backwards. Can you now use these facts to help you learn your times tables for the 2, 5 and 10 tables?	Learn to spell the names of some common flowering plants such as rose, daisy, buttercup, iris and tulip.
Have you been to a different country which has a different climate? Can you write a weather report for this place?	Can you grow a herb garden at home? Take some photos and bring them into school.
Paint or draw flowers or plants you can see in your garden or local park. Do you know their names? Can you label your picture?	Can you create a garden in a box? What would you use? What would you make your flowers and plants from? Take photos or carefully bring it into class.
What is your favourite fairy tale? Can you write a book review about it?	Write a letter to our class telling us what you have been doing at home during Christmas. We'd love to hear about your adventures!
