Mathematics Focus- Numberblocks

Remember to watch each episode with a grown up and talk about what's going on and then try to replay the mathematical principles using pen and paper/ toys/ playdough. You don't just have to use the numerals in each episode, go higher or lower

Here is this week's episodes of Numberblocks which will develop our knowledge of shapes.

After watching it, take a look at and see if you have some stick shaped resources (pens, chopsticks, sticks). What shapes can you make using them? There are lots to make from four sticks.

Tangrams are Chinese shape puzzles and we will use a set of them to help us develop our geometry skills. I have attached a PowerPoint to challenge you and your tangram skills. Have a go at making some of your own shapes too.
