

Homework Activities for Show and Tell. Spring 2 Term

Here are a selection of fun activities that will support your child with their learning this term. Each week two children will receive a letter informing them it is their turn for Show and Tell. When your child is chosen, they can choose any activity from this list, complete it at home and bring it into school to share. Any additional activities your child completes can be brought into school to show me at any time.

To support the gospel value of FRIENDSHIP this half term, write a prayer that shows why you forgive someone.	Search the internet to find footage of a time-lapse of a house being built. Or look at step-by-step photos. What machinery was used? How long did it take? Perhaps you could make a non-fiction booklet to show what you have found out or the steps taken to build the house.
Look in detail at the outside of your house and make a careful observational drawing.	Talk to someone who has lived in your community for a long time. What changes have they seen? Which things are better or worse today? (You may have to do this via Zoom)
Draw a simple plan or map of your neighbourhood. Name all the streets and house numbers.	Draw and label a design for your own fantasy house. What will your home be built from? How will you get in and out of your house? What will you have in your garden?
Learn your times table facts for the 2, 5, and 10's and the associated division facts. Learn to count in steps of 3.	Make a model of your fantasy house. What materials will you use and why?
Draw a plan or map of your ideal neighbourhood. Who would you like to live on your street? You might choose fairy tale characters, sports champions or pop stars. What type of house would they live in?	Visit a local shop with a grown up. Write a shopping list before you go. Pay for your shopping and work out your change.
Talk to your grand-parents about what life was like when they were young. What was the same/different to now?	Make a PowerPoint of your local community. Take photos of local landmarks and research facts about them. Add these details to your PowerPoint.
Make a map of your home and local area to show all the main features. Include physical landmarks such as hills and woods. Where would be a good place to hide your treasure?	Write a letter to our class telling us what you have been doing at home. We'd love to hear about your adventures!
