### **Our Curriculum:**

Reading & Writing: This term we will be covering a variety of writing styles. We will start with Science Fiction stories, Play scripts, Explanation, Arguments, Poetry and formal/impersonal writing. Reading in school is an important part of the day, the children spend at least 20 minutes reading each day and complete age appropriate comprehension questions every Monday. Along with our Book club which will start back up this term. We will also read our class novel together at the end of the day and discuss what we have read and make predictions base on this.

Mathematics: This term our focus is Geometry, measurement and re-cap the formal methods for the four operations.

RE: Ideas about God and Exploring lives of significant women in the Old Testament.

### **Home Learning:**

**Reading:** In order to be competent readers, children need to read regularly at home and school. Parents are asked to encourage their children to read regularly and read for pleasure. We ask parents to sign and date reading diaries every time you hear your child read and ensure books are in school daily. Reading diaries will be checked in school and we expect a minimum of two entries/comments a week. This is an ideal opportunity to question your child on their understanding of the text, to improve their comprehension skills and vocabulary. These books are intended as 'home' readers as the children read a separate text in their English lessons. Book club is a huge part of Year 5 and 6 so please make sure it is completed at home and brought into school on the requested day.

Spelling: Spellings will be given to children every Monday, the children need to learn the spelling rule and also be able to put those words into a sentence.

Times Tables: Children should now know all of their multiplication tables so practice using times table rockstars will reinforce their understanding.
