

Class Halton Summer Term Homework Activities

Here are a selection of fun activities that will support your child with their learning this term. Each week, two children will receive a letter informing them it is their turn for Show and Tell. When your child is chosen, they can choose any activity from this list, complete it at home and bring it into school to share. Any additional activities your child completes can be brought into school to show me at any time.

Go on a garden animal hunt! Write a list of the insects and animals you find. Write a sentence about the natural habitat you found them in.	Find some interesting leaves and see if you can make rubbings of them using crayons or coloured pencils. Similarly, have a go at some flower pressing!	Cooking Can you make a dish that uses different parts of a plant? (flower, stem, roots, leaves). Take pictures of your creation!
Keep a food diary for a week which shows the plants you have been eating and the parts that they come from. If you eat meat, which animal does it come from?	With an adult take a walk around your local area. Can you make a map showing landmarks eg. Church or Post Office?	Draw butterflies to show all of the number bonds to 20. Can you also write 1 - 20 in words?
Find 4 different flowers or plants that grow in your garden (or nearby park). Look at and draw them carefully. See if you can find out what they are called and label them?	Play games with numbers like snakes and ladders or dominoes. Try to recognise the numbers. Using a number-square, count forwards and backwards and identify odd and even numbers.	Can you write an acrostic poem using the word 'Summer?' S - Sunshine. U - Up in the sky a kite is flying. M - Many people at the beach. M - Munching sandwiches at our picnic. E - Everywhere is bright and warm. R - Ready to splash in the paddling pool
Write a new version of 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar.' What will he eat each day?	If you visit a zoo or another exciting place then bring in some information leaflets. Draw a picture and write a sentence about your favourite thing you saw.	What do plants need to grow? Draw a poster to show this.
Make a fingerprint flower garden painting.	Write the months of the year in order. Add in your family's birthdays.	Choose your favourite fiction or non-fiction book and write a book review.

	<p>Write a short diary entry about the things you have done this week or over the weekend. You may wish to draw a picture to show what you have been doing. Remember your capital letters and full stops.</p>	<p>On a piece of paper, carefully write down in pencil at least five words that remind you of Summer - sunflowers, ice-cream, the beach - for example. Then in crayon, carefully trace over each word three times. Each time use a different colour crayon. A rainbow will appear!</p>
