Royal Mail Stamp Competition

Today I shared with children in Celebration Assembly that we are taking part in the Royal Mail Heroes Stamp Design Competition. Children will be bringing home a stamp template for them to create their designs at home.

This competition honours the key worker and volunteer heroes of the coronavirus pandemic. Children may wish to celebrate NHS frontline workers, school staff, supermarket workers, delivery drivers, public transport workers, military personnel, emergency services, food bank volunteers, cleaners. The list goes on.

Royal Mail are looking for 8 stamp designs in total and, as with all Royal Mail special stamps all designs will need to be approved by Her Majesty The Queen before they are sent to print.

There are 120 prizes to be won – from Regional Runners Up prizes (£100 of high street vouchers) to Regional Winners (£500 of high street vouchers) to the Overall Winners (£1000 of high street vouchers).

Top Design Tips

Designs must comply with the theme "honouring the heroes of the pandemic" and must work when reduced to the size of a stamp.

Encourage lots of colour for visual appeal (no black and white entries). Rich colours and clear design are preferred.

Please avoid fluorescent inks or highlighter pens.

Use up at much white space as possible on the template.

Do not copy other artwork on the design as you will be disqualified.

Please do **not** include the silhouette of The Queen or the value of the stamp on the design.

Please note entries can not be returned so take a copy if you want to keep your design.
