**As writers** we will learn to record our thoughts through spoken words, pictures, marks and to write letters and words which match their spoken sound.

As readers we will listen to and share a variety of literature and develop the skills needed for independent reading.

As communicators we will talk about ourselves and our interests and learn about the value of listening to others.

As mathematicians we will develop our skills in number, space, shape and measure.

**As scientists** we will look closely at similarities, differences, patterns and change and will ask questions which challenge our thinking.

**As historians** we will talk about our memories of special times and learn about historical events such as Harvest, Remembrance Day and Christmas.

**As geographers** we will observe features of our immediate environment and record how they change as Autumn and Winter develop.

**As design and technologists** we will explore a variety of materials in our workshop and use construction resources to create models.

As artists we will look at and interpret the work of Andy Goldsworthy and Christianity through art.

**As musicians** we will explore a variety of musical instruments and examine how their sounds can change. We will be learning new songs and singing favourite songs and rhymes.

## Additional curriculum areas
