
#### **ECB Clubs**

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#### Pyjamarama Day

This year Pyjamarama Day is Friday 13<sup>th</sup> May and we will be participating in a range of events encompassing reading and forest school activities.

We would like School and Nursery children to come to school in their pyjamas and to bring their favourite book to share with their peers. Please expect children to spend some of the day outside so waterproof shoes rather than slippers as footwear; and additional layers for when they are outside (not dressing gowns).

Each class will be presented with challenges and mini-challenges to complete during the day. Points will be earned for these challenges and these will then be converted into new class library books.

Children will be engaging in normal lessons & activities when not carrying out these challenges so Rigby & Venables children will have PE as normal and the Athletics after school club for children in Halton & Lucas will also be running. Children will wear the PE kits they have in school for these activities. Nursery & Crane will also have Forest school for which they have wellies in school.

The literacy themed activities planned for the children will include putting up tents on the school field to be used as reading dens, book hunts, orienteering, an archaeological dig, sharing books and creating book covers.
