## **Science Week**

The theme of this year is connections. Throughout the week our children will be learning about key scientists linked to their current unit of study, completing investigations as well as completing on of our '50 Things To Do At Newburgh' – 'flying a kite'.

On Tuesday after school, our Head Boy and Head Girl will be hosting a science pop up gadget shop in the hall at 3.30pm. Children are invited to purchase gadgets (items range from £1-£3) and with every purchase they will be entered into a raffle with the chance to win a science kit. All funds raised from this shop will go towards developing our pond area in our spiritual garden.

If your child is in an afterschool club on Tuesday, please send money to school in a named envelope and staff will take them to the shop.

### **Team Rigby Roman/Celt Day**

Team Rigby will be having a whole class themed day focusing on the Romans and Celts on Thursday 30<sup>th</sup> March. There will be a range of activities provided by Portals of the Past.

To add to the fun and enhance the learning, we would like to invite the children to dress up for this.

This does not need to be costly – sheets can be wrapped around for a Roman tunic, rugs and blankets used for the Celts. A shield or sword can be made from card or sponge. We will need a range of different roles so here are some ideas to help:

- Roman slaves a large t-shirt with a piece of string tied round the middle & sandals
- Roman soldier large red t-shirt, strip of cloth for a scarf, cardboard armour, helmet, shield
- Roman citizen large piece of cloth draped over the shoulder and fixed with a pin, jewellery etc.
- Celts clashing checked clothing, spiky hair, blue face, arms, spears (only rich Celts had swords)
- Rich Celt make a gold hoop to wear around the neck
- Chain mail can be made from onion bags from the supermarket sprayed silver.
